As part of our community helpers' theme, the children participated in a variety of engaging hands-on activities that helped them understand the roles of people who care for us and keep us safe. Through role play, learners pretended to be doctors, nurses, and patients, The children also showed gratitude by creating thank-you cards for the class akkas and security staff, appreciating their everyday support and care. To learn about people who keep us safe, learners designed colourful safety badges representing police officers, firefighters, and traffic helpers.



The children explored the Community Helpers theme through engaging role play, pretending to be policemen, firefighters, traffic police, and soldiers. Outdoors, they used water sprayers to knock down paper cups marked with a fire symbol, learning about the role of firefighters in a fun and active way.

They also took part in simple health and science activities, including making fingerprint impressions, learning correct tooth-brushing movements, and observing the soap and pepper experiment to understand how germs spread and how soap helps keep us clean



EXPLORING SHAPES

Our toddlers joyfully explored the world of shapes through a variety of hands-on and movement-based activities. They loved making shapes with dough, finger painting within outlines, sponge stamping, and creating shapes in sand. They enjoyed movement activities like walking along a big circle and playing the Four Corners shape game. Songs, stories, videos, shape sorting, and exploring shapes with food made learning engaging and meaningful, helping build early math understanding, coordination, and sensory skills.


